NY CE Reporting Period

Every dentist and dental hygienist registered to practice with a New York State license must take continuing education to be eligible for registration renewal. New York State Education Law requires dentists to complete 60 contact hours of continuing education in each three-year registration period. Dental hygienists are required to complete 24 contact hours of continuing education during each three-year registration period. Dentists must complete 42 of the 60 contact hours required for a three-year registration via live courses. Dental hygienists must complete 14 of the 24 contact hours required for a three-year registration via live courses. The balance of remaining hours may be completed through appropriate selfstudy courses.

Oral Cancer: Who's at Risk and What About HPV? John R. Kalmar, DMD, PhD

This course will examine and discuss the conventional visual and tactile examination of the dental patient, with an emphasis on the clinical features of precancerous and cancerous lesions. Case-based examples will be used to emphasize high-risk settings and physical characteristics that can help distinguish worrisome lesions from other conditions. Current data on the relationship of human papillomavirus (HPV) infection with oral cancer and tonsillar cancer will be reviewed. The use of adjuncts in the detection and analysis of oral cancer and precancerous lesions will be discussed, including recently available saliva-based tests.

- Review clinical evaluation of the dental patient
- Review current concepts of oral cancer and precancerous lesions
- Understand the scientific evidence behind devices as adjuncts in the detection of oral cancer

Practical Oral Pathology John R. Kalmar, DMD, PhD

This course is designed to aid the dental professional with the detection, diagnosis and management of lesions and conditions encountered in daily practice. Casebased examples will be used to help participants recognize the signs and symptoms of common as well as significant oral diseases. Special emphasis will be given to: 1) skin lesions, 2) ulcerative conditions and 3) radiographic abnormalities.
